

Adopted Values & Ideas

Virginia's Definition of School Readiness

"School readiness" describes the capabilities of children, their families, schools, and communities that will best promote student success in kindergarten and beyond. Each component – children, families, schools and communities – plays an essential role in the development of school readiness. No one component can stand on its own.

- **Ready Children:** A ready child is prepared socially, personally, physically, and intellectually within the developmental domains. Children develop holistically; growth and development in one area depends upon development in other areas.
- **Ready Families:** A ready family has adults who understand they are the most important people in the child's life and take responsibility for the child's school readiness through direct, frequent, and positive involvement and interest in the child. Adults recognize their role as the child's first and most important teacher, providing steady and supportive relationships, ensuring safe and consistent environments, promoting good health, and fostering curiosity, excitement about learning, determination, and self-control.
- **Ready Schools:** A ready school accepts all children and provides a seamless transition to a high-quality learning environment by engaging the whole community. A ready school welcomes all children with opportunities to enhance and build confidence in their skills, knowledge, and abilities. Children in ready schools are led by skilled teachers, who recognize, reinforce, and extend children's strengths and who are sensitive to cultural values and individual differences.
- **Ready Communities:** A ready community plays a crucial part in supporting families in their role as primary stewards of children's readiness. Ready communities, including businesses, faith-based organizations, early childhood service providers, community groups and local governments, work together to support children's school and long term success by providing families affordable access to information, services, high-quality child care, and early learning opportunities.

Strategies:

#1 Ensure our programs and services support community needs and strengthen the capacity of local service providers.

Data from community assessment, self-assessment, parent input, and state evidence drives service delivery.

Support Centers/Schools/Family Day Homes in efforts to meet developmentally appropriate practice, state mandates, licensing requirements, Virginia quality, and COVID restrictions.

#2 Build and maintain a strong organizational structure and multidisciplinary team that includes parents in decision making to deliver on our mission.

Leadership Teams are diverse and represent our community across disciplines.

Structures support and include all VECF grants, and state, local, and federal funding for early childhood effort in our community.

#3 Create & maintain a strategic and sustainable approach to fund development.

Secure local funding for Smart Beginnings Greater Harrisonburg.

Work collaboratively with community partners to secure innovative partnerships and grant funding to address identified needs.

H4 Develop a comprehensive Developmental Screening System across our service area to build a continuum of developmental and behavioral care to reduce barriers and gaps and promote equity for all children and their families.

Increase screening using a parent administered evidence-based screening tool

Coordinate among community systems to assure that timely assessment, referrals, and follow up occur

Provide messaging for families and community about the importance of ongoing screening, monitoring, referral, and follow-up of child development
